KIDS FOOD SCHOOL

STARTING THIS FALL AT THE ALEXANDER FARM

The **Kids Food School** is a toddler-to-elder enrichment program based on the generational wisdom of Alexander forebearers who taught their descendants, *"As long as you have some seed and a bit of land, you can also have good food."* Passed within its African-American-owner family for 176 years and counting - THE ALEXANDER FARM - has partnered with Dr. Clarence Bunch at the Prairie View A&M University School of Agriculture to offer this local enrichment program to pre-schoolers, their college-age-mentors, and Austin community elders.

The program will be composed of **three on-site, hands-on sessions**:

- **Session 1:** Planting heirloom seeds from family progenitor Daniel Alexander's 1810 birth year and birth place at THE ALEXANDER FARM. Expert guidance provided by 6th-generation Alexander family farming descendants and peer-age team teachers will provide at-the-elbow assistance.
- **Session 2:** Nurturing germinating plants check-in, followed by the Olabisi Dorcas Agboola Animal Science Session with Black Texas Rodeo Riders in demonstration mode
- **Session 3:** Harvesting and preparation of heirloom food crops with noted Black Austin chefs.
